The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Cape Girardeau, State of Missouri, charges that the defendant, either acting alone or knowingly in concert with another, in violation of Section 195.202, RSMo, committed the Class A misdemeanor of possession of a controlled substance (32455) (3562), punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011.1(5) and 560.016, RSMo, in that on or about June 8, 2007, in the County of Cape Girardeau, State of Missouri, the defendant possessed marijuana, a controlled substance, knowing of its presence and illegal nature.

Count II

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Cape Girardeau, State of Missouri, charges that the defendant, either acting alone or knowing y in concert with another, in violation of Section 195.233, RSMo, committed the class A misdemeanor of possession of drug paraphernalia with intent to use (32505) (3550), punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 560.016, RSMo, in that on or about June 8, 2007, in the County of Cape Girardeau, State of Missouri, the defendant possessed a gold smoking pipe, which was drug paraphernalia, knowing of its presence and rature, with the intent to use it to ingest, inhale or otherwise introduce into the human body a controlled substance or an imitation controlled substance.

Count III

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Cape Girardeau, State of Missouri, charges that the defendant, either acting alone or knowingly in concert with another, in violation of Section 577.010, RSMo, committed the Class B misdemeanor of criving while intoxicated (47420)(5404), punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 560.016, RSMo, in that on or about June 8, 2007, upon U.S. highway 61 rear the intersection of Route Y, in the County of Cape Girardeau, State of Missouri, the defendant operated a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol.

Count IV

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Cape Girardeau, State of Missouri, charges that the defendant, either acting alone or knowingly in concert with another, in violation of Section 304.015, RSMo, committed the infraction of failure to drive on the right half of the roadway (47225) (5405), punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011 and 560.016, RSMo, in that on or about June 8, 2007, in the County of Cape Girardeau, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly operated a motor vehicle on U.S. Highway 61 near Route Y, and failed to drive motor vehicle on the right half of the roadway when said roadway was of sufficient width.




Counts I & II: One day to one year in the county jail, or a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars, or by both such imprisonment and fine.

PROBABLE CAUSE STATEMENT

- I, <u>D. McDaniel</u>, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true.
- 1. I have probable cause to believe that <u>Kevin P. Bohnert</u> committed one or more criminal offenses.
- 2. The facts supporting this belief are as follows:
- 1. On June 8, 2007, at approximately 0219 hours, I arrested Kevin P. Bohnert, date of birth April 11, 1958, for Driving While Intoxicated, Failed to Drive on the Right Half of the Roadway, Possession of Marijuana (Misd) and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.
- 2. On June 8, 2007, at approximately 0154 hours, I was traveling southbound on U.S. 61 just north of Missouri Route Y, when I observed and later identified a mirroon 2002 Lincoln LS, bearing Missouri 1BN-12C registration, also traveling southbound. While behind the vehicle, I observed it cross the white painted shoulder line once. Immediately, the driver jerked the wheel to the left and crossed the yellow solid center line. I activated my emergency equipment and stopped the vehicle on U.S. 61 at Missouri Route Y.
- 3. I contacted and identified the driver with his Missouri driver's license as Kevin P. Bohnert, date of birth April 11, 1958, a white male from Jackson, Missouri. While speaking to Bohnert, I observed a strong odor of intoxicating beverage emanating from his breath. I asked Bohnert what his highest grade of education was, and he stated, "a Masters Degree." I asked him how much alcohol he had to drink and he stated, "two to three earlier tonight at the Ted Nuggent concert." I asked Bohnert if he had any physical defects that would hinder his performance of a one-legged stand test and he stated, "my ankles, because I'm a runner." I had Bohnert perform a series of field sobriety tests. Based on his performance and my observations, Bohnert was placed under arrest and later transported to the Cape Girardeau County Sheriff's Department. While conducting a search of the vehicle, I found a small gold smoking pipe containing un-burnt Marijuana inside the center console. A white female was seated in the passenger seat and identified as Marjorie A. Thomas, date of birth November 4, 1967. When I found the Marjorie and drug paraphernalia, I asked Thomas if it was hers and she immediately stated, East. Bohnert's vehicle was left at the scene per his request. While en route to the Cape Cirardean County Sheriff's Department, Bohnert would belch several times. Bollarert attinit integogranate times if I would just "let him go," to which I stated, "no." - 4. At the Cape Girardeau County Sheriff's Department, Bohnert was read his worked Ryght.

The datamaster breathalyzer was set up and working properly when it gave a result of .110%. Bohnert asked me, "could we just forget about the Marijuana and pipe," to which I stated, "no."

5. Bohnert was issued four summons: a) Driving While Intoxicated b) Failed to Drive on the Right Half c) Possession of Marijuana (Misd) d) Possession of Drug Paraphernalia Bohnert was released to the jailer.	#060527241 #060527242 #060527243 #060527244
